1 Risk Management Policy

Ten Pin Bowling WA strives to manage risk effectively in order to protect the organisations assets, stakeholders, environment and reputation and to ensure achievement of its organisation's objectives.

Risk Management will form part of strategic, operational and planning responsibilities and integrated into the strategic and business planning process. We will aim to achieve a fuller understanding of the risk/reward balance and seek to reduce the likelihood and consequences of adverse effects to acceptable levels. To achieve continual improvement in our management of risk, we endeavour to engage appropriately, thereby enhancing our certainty in achieving our business objectives.

The identified risks for Tenpin Bowling Association of Western Australia Inc will be reviewed by the Audit, Finance and Risk Management Committee. Consultants may be retained from time to time to advise and assist in the risk management process and/or management of specific risk, and subgroups appointed to assist. Every member, volunteer, athlete and employee of Tenpin Bowling Association of Western Australia Inc, is recognised as playing a role in the awareness and implementation of risk management and encouraged to take part in this process.

1.1 Objectives

The organisation will endeavour to develop, implement and maintain sound risk management practices and systems that are consistent with industry best practice and that will address the following objectives:

- Identify, assess and manage risks in an effective and efficient manner;
- Make decisions based on a comprehensive view of the reward to risk balance;
- Provide greater certainty on the delivery of objectives; and
- Satisfy our Tenpin Bowling Australia Ltd governance and legislative requirements.

In pursuing these objectives, the organisation will endeavour to:

- Implement a comprehensive and systematic risk assessment process across all bowling activities TBAWA has effective control over;
- Create an environment within the organisation that controls and mitigates risk within the accepted TBAWA risk tolerance;
- Integrate the outputs of TBAWA stakeholders to provide an informed view of the risks associated with our business activities;
- Heighten risk management awareness in our business processes, with an emphasis on instilling this awareness in all of our stakeholders;
- Foster a culture of continuous improvement in risk management through audit and review processes; and
- Allocate adequate resources to the reduction of risk identified at all levels of the organisation and its activities.
